Channel Islands Shipping Forecast prepared for the area bounded by latitude 50°N, the French coasts between Cap de la Hague and Ile de Brehat, and longitude 3°W.

Issued by the Jersey Met Department at 4am Thursday, 02 February 2017 for the period ending 7am on Saturday.

At the time of issue there were Gale Warnings in force for Sea Areas Portland and Plymouth.

At the time of issue there was a Gale Warning in force for the Channel Islands area.

General Situation

At midnight low, 959mb, 600 miles west of Ushant expected to move northeast with associated fronts over the Channel clearing the area by midday. Low, 1005 mb, mid-Atlantic expected 982mb near the mouth of the Channel by Friday afternoon.

Forecast from 7am on Thursday until 7am on Friday.

Wind: South to southeast 6 to 7, locally gale 8 in the north, veering southwest by

evening, decreasing 5 in the south, generally backing south 5 to 6 towards

dawn.

Weather: Mist patches and occasional rain, locally heavy, clearing by late morning.

Scattered showers by late afternoon.

Visibility: Moderate to poor, occasionally good.

Sea State: Moderate to rather rough in the south, rough in the north, locally very

rough by evening.

Swell: Confused with total waves 6 to 9 feet in the south, 12 to 20 feet in the

north.

westerly later in the afternoon, perhaps locally storm 10 with gusts to 65kt, decreasing 6 to gale 8 before midnight, backing southwest to south 4 to 5

before dawn.

Weather: Isolated showers until early morning. Outbreaks of rain spreading in from

Visibility: Moderate to poor, occasionally good.

Sea State: Moderate to rather rough with swell, increasing rough to very rough in the

afternoon, slowly decreasing overnight.
